- High proportion of Asylum Seekers and Refugees from sub Saharan Africa
- · High proportion of patients with a history of substance misuse
- A significant number of sex workers registered at the practice
- A direct response to a critical clinical incident



Getting started 2007

- Looking at guidelines and governance for *rapid* HIV testing
- Establishing a nurse led service
- Establishing a relationship with GUM
- Researching testing kits
- Establish an agreed practice protocol





Delivery of service


- · Training for Nursing team
