Facilitating a Support group



- ▶ **TIME** - be realistic. Weekly? monthly ?
- ▶ **SECURITY** – ensure all participants are checked out!
- ▶ **TALK** – involve people in the decision making process
- ▶ **DE MEDICALISE** – Involve teams with an interest.
Why have medical lead??!!??
- ▶ **TRAINING /AWARENESS** – must be on-going and inclusive

Staff support




- Eradicate the **STIGMA**

 - Kitchen staff – employed prisoners **DO** work on therapy



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Why look after your liver?
Other than my knob, it's one of the largest organs I've got and it's just as important. It's got over **500** different jobs (one liver, not me knob).

Like:
It breaks down poisons in your body - including alcohol
Cleans your blood and keeps you healthy
Stores vitamins and minerals
Helps digest food
Manages your hormones

Love your liver - reduces how much you drink, eat healthy food and exercise. If your liver isn't happy it will affect your whole body.

Hepatitis B
Like a bad attitude, you might not know you've got Hep B. Most people clear the virus on their own, without realising, but it can make you feel **Moby Dick** (sick). And if you've got Hep B and need treatment, you can get a vaccination for Hep B Moby Dick and need treatment.

and
You can get a vaccination for Hep B but not for Hep C. Ask your GP. Hep B is a blood borne virus which tries to attack your liver. You can get it from doing the same things that give you Hep C (see page 6).

Also having:
sex without condoms
blood transfusions in countries where they don't screen donated blood
tattoos and piercing if it's not done by a licensed outlet



